

**MAYOR'S COURT
CITY OF MONROE, OHIO**

In response to the recent outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in Ohio. There are multiple confirmed cases of COVID-19, in response to which the President of the United States Donald J. Trump has declared a national State of Emergency, and the Governor of the State of Ohio, Michael DeWine, has declared a State of Emergency in Ohio (Executive Order 2020-01D) which, among other restrictions, limits large indoor gatherings. The Governor's Declaration follows the Center of Disease Control and Prevention "Interim Guidance," recommending that all employers consider how best to decrease the spread of COVID-19, including the review of guidance from state and local health officials. 
In light of the foregoing, it is HEREBY ORDERED that the following will be in effect within the Monroe Mayor's Court.
